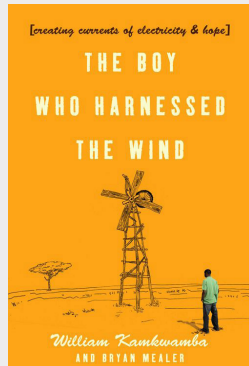


The One Book Project is a community-wide reading & discussion project inviting everyone to read and discuss the themes in *The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind*.

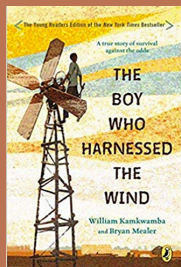

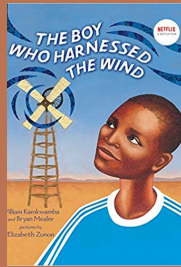

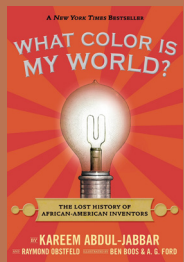
